He came back with the cart and another young man. The young man said can I tell you a story? He went on to explain that, not five minutes before I had arrived, the chef had cut his hand while cutting the bread to make the dressing for their community meal to be served on Thursday, and he had just called his boss to say there would be no dressing because he was unable to continue because of the injury to his hand. Then I arrived at the door, knocking and asking if he needed dressing. His confused look was because he thought I was an angel. ☺ GOD IS SO FAITHFUL.
